He covers the history, including championship seasons and legendary rivalries such as the annual Turkey Day Classic game between Houston schools Jack Ross and Phillis Wheatley, which drew standing-room-only crowds of up to 40,000. In telling this story, Hurd explains why the PVIL was necessary for the development, and shows how football offered a potent source of pride and ambition in the black community, helping black kids succeed academically and educationally in a racist society.
