In considering this subject one of the things I think we ought to do is to compare plant and animal breeding, and some of the fundamental differences' between them. We are more familiar with animal breeding than we are with plant breeding. In the case of animal breeding one seldom hears of a man attempting to breed a new race. The production of a new race of animals is so rare that it is a matter of history. Ordinarily speaking, we are satisfied with the dairy herd at the present time, taking the various breeds which already exist. In the case

of any of our standard breeds the selection of the individual breeder is ordinarily within the confines of that race. The different individuals of the race vary considerably and the breeder is engaged in selecting the best. The plant breeder, on the contrary, ordinarily strives to produce new races or breeds, differing from the known sorts in some important characters, by which the new variety or race may be recognized. The new varieties or races of the plant breeder would correspond to the different breeds of animals. If a breeder produces a new type of wheat he wants some new character. He breeds to get some distinguishing characters, so that the main differences between the two types of breeding is that the animal breeder is breeding to develop strains within the race, while the plant breeder is breeding to develop new races or varieties. The striving after markedly new varieties has led the plant breeder to largely overlook the advancement that may be wrought within the variety by pedigree breeding.
