*This dissertation consists of two manuscripts to explore how university-level English language learners (ELLs) learn to paraphrase. The first study explored how Arab English Language learners (AELLS) understand, perform, and evaluate written paraphrasing. A case study examined the data of five AELLS collected through three data collection sources: (a) background questionnaire, (b) paraphrasing task documents, and (c) semi-structured interviews. The data were coded and then individually compared for each of the five participants for similarities and differences and also to discover patterns among them. The findings of this study included that AELLS face difficulty with paraphrasing and their paraphrases are often evaluated as unacceptable. To support these AELLS, this study proposed a new definition of paraphrasing and a set of paraphrasing guidelines. Based on the first paper, the second paper explored the use of the paraphrasing guidelines in instruction to support graduate ELLs in paraphrasing. Fourteen graduate ELLs participated in this study and their data, along with the instructor's thoughts and ideas, were collected through six data sources including: background questionnaire, video instruction, pre-test and posttest, task documents, stimulation recall interviews, and teacher interviews. The findings of the study showed that the explicit instruction of paraphrasing has effectively supported the*

*implementation of the guidelines. In addition, the participants' outcomes in the posttest improved and their perception about using paraphrasing guidelines was positive and showed their willingness to use them in the future.*

*Visual Paraphrasing introduces a method for helping students from high school through college to read poetry with more accuracy and personal involvement. Like verbal paraphrasing, sketches help the reader see what is literally described in a poem, what is not, and what is ambiguous. The technique combines traditional interpretive ends with means compatible with reader-response theory and process-oriented writing approaches. The book contains an introduction relating the technique to literary theory, for those interested in such issues. Those primarily concerned with helping students learn to read poetic language may skip to the examples, which move from the extremely simple to the sublimely complex. Examples of the technique applied to prose are also included, as are some related applications of drawing for the teaching of literature (maps, schemata of world-views, and illustration as opposed to visual paraphrase).*

*This study looks at how oral histories are constructed and how they should be interpreted, and argues for a deeper understanding of their oral and social characteristics. Oral accounts of past events are also guides to the future, as well as being social activities in which tellers claim authority to speak to particular audiences. Like written history and literature, orality has its shaping genres and aesthetic conventions and, likewise, has to be interpreted through them. The argument is illustrated through a wide range of examples of memory, narration and oral tradition, including many from Europe and the Americas, and with a particular focus on oral histories from the Jlao Kru of Liberia, with whom Elizabeth Tonkin has carried out extensive research. Tonkin also draws on and integrates the insights of a range of other disciplines, such as literary criticism, linguistics, history, psychology, and communication and cultural studies.*

Another group of essays explore the global influence of Manhattan as a contemporary Babylon to be replicated across the world, or the role of the Italian Futurists, Japanese Metabolists, and Archigram, who influenced generations of architects and designers to push forward the concept of vertical living. In the Opinion section you will find critiques on some of the latest ideas for skyscraper design by some of the most forward-looking architects like the concept of pixilated tectonics in Le Project Triangle in Paris by Herzog & de Meuron and the Sky Village by MVRDV. On the other hand, Jean Nouvel redefined the Italian loggia towers of the seventeenth century with the Tour Signal in La Defense, Paris; while Morphosis Architects explores new programs for vertical density with The Phare Tower. Lastly, Studio SHIFT masterfully integrates their Miyi Tower in Sichuan, China, with the existing landscape. Central to this book are thirty projects from eVolo's 2009 Skyscraper Competition which look into the future of the skyscraper with the use of new technologies, programs, and aesthetic expression. Sustainability, globalization, flexibility, and adaptability are just some of the multi-layered elements explored by some the entries. You will find examples of cities in the sky, horizontal skyscrapers that link various cities, or emergency architecture for disaster zones.

This book, offered here in its first open-access edition, addresses a wide range of writing activities and genres, from summarizing and responding to sources to writing the research paper and writing about literature. This edition of the book has been adapted from the fifth edition, published in 1995 by Houghton Mifflin. Copyrighted materials—primarily examples within the text—have been removed from this edition.
