Sherlock Holmes, the world's "only unofficial consulting detective", was first introduced to readers in *A Study in Scarlet* published by Sir Arthur Conan Doyle in 1887. It was with the publication of *The Adventures of Sherlock Holmes*, however, that the master sleuth grew tremendously in popularity, later to become one of the most beloved literary characters of all time. In this book series, the short stories comprising *The Adventures of Sherlock Holmes* have been amusingly illustrated using only Lego® brand minifigures and bricks.
